Match these tracks to the pictures and descriptions of the animals that made them.

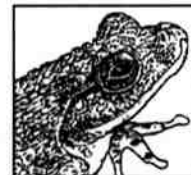
A. Gorilla

When gorillas walk through the forest they use their knuckles to support their weight. So in addition to footprints they also leave knuckle prints!



E. Goliath Frog

The 7-pound goliath frog is the largest frog in the world. It has a big appetite too. While other frogs usually eat flies and mosquitoes, the goliath frog feasts on prey as large as a mouse.



B. Hippos

As hippos tunnel through the forest underbrush looking for food they actually help create trails.



F. Duikers

These small to medium sized antelopes live in dense forests or thickets. Their name comes from an Afrikaans word meaning "divers", which describes their habit of diving into cover when they are disturbed.



C. Elephants

African elephants are the largest land mammals in the world. They also trample through the forests clearing paths for humans and other animals to use.



G. Giant Forest Hog

These large hogs have very prominent snouts and distinctive tusks. They have a good sense of smell and hearing and are quite vocal. Family groups communicate almost non-stop through squeals, chirrups and grunts..



D. Gaboon Viper

A gaboon viper is a beautiful but deadly creature. It's heart-shaped head can be mistaken for a fallen leaf, but its long fangs deliver a poisonous bite.
