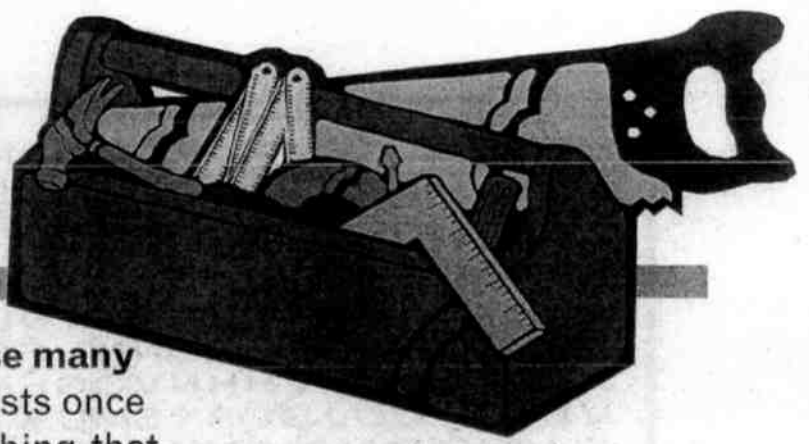


Tool Time

With the Chimps!



Did you know that chimpanzees use many different objects as tools? Scientists once thought that toolmaking was something that only people could do. But Jane Goodall, the world's most famous primatologist, discovered that chimps make and use tools. They use leaves, grasses, sticks and rocks to "fish", hammer, crush, drink, swat and scare. They are able to use and make tools because they have flexible hands and **BIG BRAINS!**
